

Abed ready to bring it home

IT IS TIME to break the shackles and remove the yoke which the current Government has placed around Barbadian necks for the past 13 years.

And it is up to the Democratic Labour Party (DLP) and Taan "the action man" Abed to do so.

At the opening of his constituency office at his home in Rendezvous, Christ Church, Abed, DLP candidate for Christ Church West, told party faithfuls why he was the man for the job.
